Entrance Antiphon

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

The Opening Prayer

Grant, almighty God,

that we may celebrate with heartfelt devotion these days of joy, which we keep in honour of the risen Lord,

and that what we relive in remembrance we may always hold to in what we do.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever. Amen.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8, 14-17

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm

R. Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

Cry out with joy to God all the earth,/ O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise./ Say to God: 'How tremendous your deeds! **R**. 'Before you all the earth shall bow;/ shall sing to you, sing to your name!' Come and see the works of God,/ tremendous his deeds among men. **R**. He turned the sea into dry land,/ they passed through the river dry-shod. Let our joy then be in him;/ he rules for ever by his might. **R**. Come and hear, all who fear God./ I will tell what he did for my soul: Blessed be God who did not reject my prayer/ nor withhold his love from me. **R**.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter 3:15-18

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia!

All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 14:15-21

Jesus said to his disciples:

'If you love me you will keep my commandments.

I shall ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you for ever,

that Spirit of truth whom the world can never receive since it neither sees nor knows him;

but you know him, because he is with you, he is in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come back to you.

In a short time the world will no longer see me; but you will see me, because I live and you will live.

On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you.

Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him.'

Scripture notes:

Looking at the Gospels provides us with the 'commandments that Jesus left us, not those of Moses. **Do not:** 'Do not return evil for evil'; 'Do not judge or condemn your neighbour and you will not be judged or condemned'; 'Do not worry about food drink and clothes and store up treasures here on earth'; 'Do not let your heart be troubled. Trust in God and in me'.

Do: 'Let your light shine before people'-live in a way that we become an example to others;' 'Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you'; 'Give generously'-be generous to others and God will be generous with you; 'Forgive those who sin against you and God will forgive your sins'; 'Clean the inside of the cup and dish and the outside will become clean too'; 'Take this bread and eat it. Take this cup and drink it'; 'Love one another as I have loved you, then all will know that you are disciple of mine'. Jesus is offering us a gift. If we live by his commandments, we will have a deeper, richer and happier life here on earth and eternal life in the hereafter.
