**DID YOU KNOW**... **Sr. Angela Ryan,** (Angie McKail's sister) a Brigidine Sister since 1958, was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in the recent Queen's Birthday Honours List, for her services to the Catholic Church.

Such powerful examples of loving service in our community.

#### **Scripture Notes**

In Jesus' journey into Jerusalem, Luke portrays Jesus as one who knows his destiny and accepts it from God, telling us about incidents that happen along the way. In the first passage Jesus refuses to retaliate against the hostility he encounters. In the second passage Jesus tells His potential followers, that obedience to the call of discipleship with total dedication and commitment, are demanded. The image Jesus uses is of the ploughman creating a straight furrow, needing a high degree of focus and commitment. It implies that if we begin a task, we should give it our all. Fidelity is not always an easy road. The path may be more dangerous when it is littered with attractions rather than obstacles as we are so easily side-tracked. For us, following Christ means to be called a Christian where you are and in your chosen life. There are many ways of serving Christ and His Gospel.

The Samaritans and the Jews were mutual enemies. Jesus' response was not to advocate weakness. It demands more courage and strength not to retaliate. There is a difference between a reaction and a response. We may not have control over our reaction to something, but we can decide how to respond.

No matter how unchristian another person may act towards us, we have it in our power to act in a Christian way towards them. Revenge and retaliation only add darkness to darkness, and may satisfy our rage, but leave our hearts empty.

## The Opening Prayer

## A reading from the Book of Kings 19:16, 19-21

The Lord said to Elijah: 'Go, you are to anoint Elisha son of Shaphat, of Abel Meholah, as prophet to succeed you.' Leaving there, Elijah came to Elisha son of Shaphat as he was ploughing behind twelve yoke of oxen, he himself being with the twelfth. Elijah passed near to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left his oxen and ran after Elijah. 'Let me kiss my father and mother, then I will follow you' he said. Elijah answered, 'Go, go back; for have I done anything to you?' Elisha turned away, took the pair of oxen and slaughtered them. He used the plough for cooking the oxen, then gave to his men, who ate. He then rose, and followed Elijah and became his servant.

## A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Galatians 5:1.13-18

When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community. Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 9:51-62

As the time drew near for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem and sent messengers ahead of him. These set out, and they went into a Samaritan village to make preparations for him, but the people would not receive him because he was making for Jerusalem. Seeing this, the disciples James and John said, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to burn them up?' But he turned and rebuked them, and they went off to another village. As they travelled along, they met a man on the road who said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' Jesus answered, 'Foxes have holes and the birds of air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.' Another to whom he said, 'Follow me,' replied, 'Let me go and bury my father first.' But he answered, 'Leave the dead to bury the dead; your duty is to go and spread the news of the kingdom of God.' Another said, 'I will follow you, sir, but first let me go and say good-bye to my people at home.' Jesus said to him. 'Once the hand is laid on the plough, no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'
