For us to have fresh water we only need to walk a few metres and turn on a tap.

Another example: the provision of a children's ambulance in Ukraine. Desperately needed at this time to comfort children suffering in their war torn homeland.

Worth taking a moment to reflect on how truly blessed we are to live where we do.

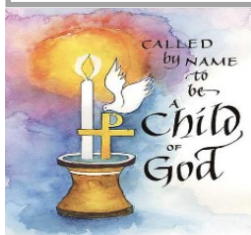

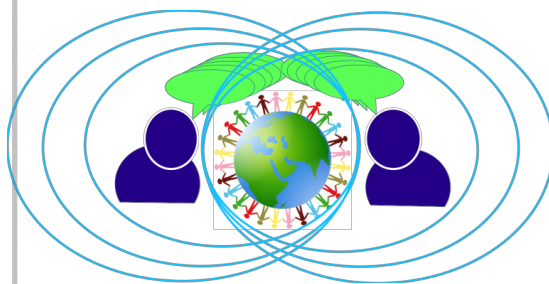

Liturgy of the Eucharist-Offertory

Once we have prayed our intercessions, we begin the second great section of the Mass. We've had the Liturgy of the Word and now we move to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Eucharist is a Greek word which simply means thanksgiving. Often these days instead of saying Mass we say the Eucharist. It is the great sacrifice of thanksgiving. First there is the procession of the gifts. The bread and the wine, and sometimes other gifts, are brought forward. As they are brought forward, so too are our whole lives. The bread and wine are symbolic of many things. All that we are, all that we have, all that we've made. The whole material world is gathered up in these gifts of bread and wine, and they are brought forward, not as something that we ourselves have created, but from all the gifts of God. In bringing those gifts forward the one thing we are saying is that everything is a gift from God. Absolutely everything. We can claim nothing of our own.

A reading from the the book of Genesis 18:1-10

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My Lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.' Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree. 'Where is your wife Sarah?' he asked him. 'She is in the tent' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail, and your wife will then have a son.'

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians 1:24-28

It makes me happy to suffer for you, as I am suffering now, and in my own body to do what I can to make up all that has still to be undergone by Christ for the sake of his body, the Church. I became the servant of the Church when God made me responsible for delivering God's message to you, the message which was a mystery hidden for generations and centuries and has now been revealed to his saints. It was God's purpose to reveal it to them and to show all the rich glory of this mystery to pagans. The mystery is Christ among you, your hope of glory: this is the Christ we proclaim, this is the wisdom in which we thoroughly train everyone and instruct everyone, to make them all perfect in Christ.

Gospel Acclamation

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 10:38-42

Jesus came to a village, and a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. She had a sister called Mary, who sat down at the Lord's feet and listened to him speaking. Now Martha who was distracted with all the serving said, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister is leaving me to do the serving all by myself? Please tell her to help me.' But the Lord answered: 'Martha, Martha,' he said, 'you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one. Scripture Notes

It might seem that Jesus is unfair to Martha, that he is even putting her down. So many times, Jesus says that those who serve are the greatest in the kingdom, and yet here he is praising the one who sits and listens over the 'doer.' He was showing concern for her, that she had her priorities wrong. Similarly, it is easy for us to become subsumed by daily chores and duties and we have trouble differentiating the important from the trivial. A period of non-doing, a time of quiet reflection, is an essential nourishment for the soul. It is not either-or...we need work and prayer integrated in our lives as Christians.

To be in the presence of God, without saying or doing anything is hard, but it is the most important way that we show our love of God. Prayer is not about words but about communion with God. Prayer is a resting in the presence of God.
