Towards Plenary Assembly One, October 2021

I am the bread of life

He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.' Matthew 28:16-20

The ethical and missionary implications of the Eucharist for the Church's communion of faith will always be incomplete while the poor go hungry, for "we cannot properly receive the Bread of Life without sharing bread for life with those in want".

The Council's opening statement and Pope Francis' message is a powerful reminder of our call to mission:

As children of God, disciples of Jesus Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit,

the Members of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia are called to develop concrete proposals to create a more missionary, Christ-centred Church in Australia at this time.

'I dream of a "missionary option", that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channelled for the evangelisation of today's world rather than for her self-preservation.'

Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium 27

In this year of St Joseph, let us turn to him to intercede for us as we journey together.

Scripture Notes

God sent the Israelites manna and quails to prevent them from dying of hunger. These were probably a natural phenomenon-quails are migratory and may have been forced to rest in the desert where they were easily caught; manna was probably a sweet resinous substance exuded by a certain desert tree, however, still gifts from God and could be seen as signs of his providence and care for his people. This manna nourished his people and sustained life temporarily. The new bread, Jesus' teaching in the Gospel, will nourish and sustain life eternally. We eat food to live, but Jesus was making the point that food alone will never fully satisfy a human being. People in business and producers simply provide what there is a demand for. The spiritual teacher must challenge people to go beyond their tastes. What people want and what they need are often 2 different things. In our world today we are tempted to live for material things alone. It is not that we deny the spirit, more that we neglect it. Jesus challenges each of us to face the deeper spiritual hunger. The 'bread' in question is primarily the teaching given by Jesus, and only at a secondary level does it refer to the Eucharist. The freedom God gave us means that we take responsibility for our own lives. By our baptism we have been called out of 'slavery' (sin, material comforts, securities etc). We have to live by faith and not by sight. No matter how difficult life may be, for those who trust in God, and live life a day at a time, the manna of His help falls every day.

O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me! You are my rescuer, my help; O Lord, do not delay

A reading from the book of Exodus (16: 2-4, 12-15)

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our heart's content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death! 'Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them in this way to see whether they will follow my law or not. I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your heart's content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God."' And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians (4: 17, 20-24)

I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live. Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life; you must put aside your old self, which gets corrupted by following illusory desires. Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth.

Gospel Acclamation

No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God **Alleluia!**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (6:24-35)

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat.

Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life, the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you,

for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.' Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'

Jesus answered: 'I tell you solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.' 'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered: 'I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'
