

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 56:1, 6-7

Thus says the Lord: Have a care for justice, act with integrity, for soon my salvation will come and my integrity be manifest. Foreigners who have attached themselves to the Lord to serve him and to love his name and be his servants - all who observe the sabbath, not profaning it, and cling to my covenant - these I will bring to my holy mountain. I will make them joyful in my house of prayer. Their holocausts and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar, for my house will be called a house of prayer for all the peoples.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans 11:13-15, 29-32

Let me tell you pagans this: I have been sent to the pagans as their apostle, and I am proud of being sent, but the purpose of it is to make my own people envious of you, and in this way save some of them. Since their rejection meant the reconciliation of the world, do you know what their admission will mean? Nothing less than a resurrection from the dead! God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice.

Just as you changed from being disobedient to God, and now enjoy mercy because of their disobedience, so those who are disobedient now - and only because of the mercy shown to you - will also enjoy mercy eventually. God has imprisoned all men in their own disobedience only to show mercy to all mankind.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! Jesus preached the Good News of the kingdom and healed all who were sick. Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 15:21-28

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.

Scripture notes

At some time or other all of us have come across someone begging in the street, and it would probably be fair to say that few of us come out of the encounter with credit. It can be disturbing. Why can't we say,' G'day' to this person? Why can't we look at them and why may we try to avoid them? Is our excuse that we have no loose change on us? The encounter can arouse conflicting opinions of pity, discomfort, anger and guilt within us. We may not like what we discover about ourselves and must be careful that we don't direct that anger at the person. The encounter can also be humbling as it can make us aware of our own poverty... in compassion and willingness to help a fellow human being and poor in our capacity to love. It can also be a blessing as it can awaken within us feelings of tenderness and compassion, kindness and communion. That it is possible to love more and to give more of ourselves. It also reminds us that before God we are all poor. The woman in the gospel was looked upon in this way but she showed such faith in her perseverance and love for her daughter. Faith impels us to persevere, to struggle on with no guarantee of a happy ending, but the knowledge that God is with us every step of the way.
