SIGN THE URGENT CALL

The Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service, and Bishops Commission for Christian Unity and Inter-religious Dialogue, have given their support to the initiative and have invited us to join with other Christians in calling for a special intake of Afghan refugees. Plenary Council Agenda:

The agenda is made up of 16 questions covering the six topics that came out of the listening and discernment process.

The third Plenary theme is Formation. Formation is not a word that we use often although it applies to all of us. It could be "understood as a continuing, lifetime process by which one grows into the likeness of Christ, according to God's will and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit." ("Laity, formation and education of," encylopedia.com). This looks like an easy definition but there is a lot in it. The Agenda items for Formation are:

- How might we better form leaders for mission adults, children and families, couples and single people?
- •How might we better equip ordained ministers to be enablers of missionary discipleship: the Church becoming more a "priestly people" served by the ordained ministry?
- •How might formation, both pre- and post-ordination, better foster the development of bishops, priests and deacons as enablers of the universal Christian vocation to holiness lived in missionary discipleship?

RETIREMENT OF 2 MORE PRIESTS:

Bishop Greg has announced that Fr Peter Bickley will retire as Administrator of St Mary's Cathedral on 12 January 2022. The Bishop said Fr Peter "will also retire from other Diocesan appointments. We thank Fr Peter for his priestly ministry at the Cathedral, for ensuring it has remained a place of welcome and hospitality to all and for his committed pastoral care of the community of the Cathedral parish and beyond. We are also grateful for his many years as Diocesan Master of Ceremonies in which he has been pivotal in such historic liturgical events."

Bishop Greg has also announced that Fr Peter Kooloos will retire as Parish Priest of Koo Wee Rup and Iona-Maryknoll on 12 January 2022. Bishop Greg said Fr Kooloos "will continue to provide canonical advice to the Bishop's Office and other bodies as required. He will retire from other Diocesan appointments. We acknowledge Fr Peter's dedicated ministry in his current appointment and for the wider canonical expertise which he has provided to the governance of the Diocese of Sale."

Both priests have served time (in the nicest of ways) in our Parish over the years.

Entrance Antiphon

A reading from the prophet Isaiah (35:4-7)

Say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy; for water gushes in the desert, streams in the wasteland, the scorched earth becomes a lake, the parched land springs of water.

A reading from the letter of St James (2:1-5)

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well -dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats;' then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that? Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, Alleluia!

Jesus preached the Good News of the kingdom and healed all who were sick. Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark (7:31-37)

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle.

Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'

Scripture Notes

This miracle is the only cure in the Gospels that is described as taking place gradually. Jesus took such care and trouble on behalf of this poor man. Mark saw it as an illustration of growth in faith. When Jesus urges those he heals to say nothing to anyone it is because he does not want a reputation as a wonder-worker. He is seeking those who will follow him in faith, not spectators who see marvels. The person who has conferred a kindness should be silent; the person who received a kindness should speak of it.

The ability to hear and speak are two great gifts that can easily be taken for granted.

How well do we use these precious gifts? Our greatest tragedy is to have ears yet fail or refuse to listen; to have tongues but fail or refuse to speak wisely and kindly professing faith in God. We need to be able to hear the word of God; profess that word on our lips and put it into practice in our daily lives.

The word of God when acted on is like a seed falling on good soil; it makes our lives fruitful.
