THE MASS SERIES – by Archbishop Mark Coleridge of the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Every 2 weeks we will, together with Archbishop Mark, share with you each part of the Mass. The series can be found on YouTube>Archdiocese of Brisbane/playlist>The Mass Series **Liturgy of the Eucharist: Rite of Peace.**

After the Lord's Prayer, we pray for peace; that which only God can give and that this feast signifies; sitting down at table with each other. To sit down with God, is to anticipate the peace that will come when all is transfigured. So, we pray for peace as we come to share the feast, and then share that peace with each other, and with God. When we offer each other the sign of peace it is not just a handshake. It is so much more. It is saying that I believe that you and I are united in the body of Christ. Because of what God has done, all barriers between you and me are down and we share life in the Body of Christ. In sharing this feast, which is the Body of Christ, I am saying that I believe that you are the Body of Christ and you are saying the same to me. The Priest says: 'the Peace of the Lord be with you.' And we reply 'and with your spirit'. We recognise the truth of each other before we come to share the feast together which is the Body of Christ. The sign of peace recognises this truth, because of what God has done, and us acknowledging this in one another.

This is not just bread and wine.-This is the Body and Blood of Christ, because of what God has done.

The Opening Prayer

A reading from the book of Kings 5:14-17

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child. Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

A reading from the second letter of Paul to Timothy 2:8-13

Remember the Good News that I carry, 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal - but they cannot chain up God's news. So, I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it. Here is a saying that you can rely on:

If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him.

If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! For all things give thanks to God, because this is what he expects of you in Christ Jesus. **Alleluia!**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 17:11-19

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them, he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away, they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' Scripture reflection: The one leper who came to thank Jesus for his cure was a Samaritan; the only one who was brought closer to God through his illness. The nine that didn't, suggests that they learnt nothing from their pain and suffering. Sadly, we are better at demanding gratitude than giving it. "We write in the sand the benefits we receive, but the injuries we write in marble." (Thomas Moore). We need to thank God as a way of acknowledging that we owe everything to Him. A grateful heart is one that is joyful and leaves no room for bitterness or other things. "No one is as capable of gratitude as one who has emerged from the kingdom of the night. We know that every moment is a moment of grace, every hour is an offering; not to share them would mean to betray them. Our lives no longer belong to us alone; they belong to all those who need us desperately. That is why I swore never to be silent whenever human beings endure suffering and humiliation. We must always take sides. Neutrality helps the oppressor, never the victim. Silence encourages the tormentor, never the victim." (Elie Weisel- Auschwitz survivor -part of his acceptance speech for his Nobel prize)
