A reading from the book of Wisdom (7:7-11)

I prayed, and understanding was given me; I entreated, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me. I esteemed her more than sceptres and thrones; compared with her, I held riches as nothing. I reckoned no priceless stone to be her peer, for compared with her, all gold is a pinch of sand, and beside her silver ranks as mud. I loved her more than health or beauty, preferred her to the light, since her radiance never sleeps. In her company all good things came to me, at her hands riches not to be numbered.

<u>Responsorial Psalm</u>

R. Fill us with your love, O Lord, and we will sing for joy!

1. Make us know the shortness of our life that we may gain wisdom of heart. Lord, relent! Is your anger for ever? Show pity to your servants. **R**.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Hebrews (4:12-13)

The word of God is something alive and active: it cuts like any double-edged sword but more finely: it can slip through the place where the soul is divided from the spirit, or joints from the marrow; it can judge the secret emotions and thoughts. No created thing can hide from him; everything is uncovered and open to the eyes of the one to whom we must give account of ourselves.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, Alleluia! Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs! Alleluia!

<u>A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark</u> (10:17-27)

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

The first reading's link with the Gospel is that Wisdom teaches us how to use the things of the world in a way that will help us achieve eternal life.

In the Gospel it shows that love of material things is a stumbling block to the kingdom. It is not the renunciation of wealth, but the life of discipleship that leads to eternal life.

The young man was in essence saying that he had kept the commandments and 'done no harm'. However, for Jesus this is the minimum requirement and wanted to encourage the young man to a new vision of goodness, not merely in avoiding evil but in doing good.

Jesus respected his freedom and let him go. There is no point in forcing people to make sacrifices. Love of material possessions and comforts is one of the chief obstacles in the way of true discipleship. When Jesus says, "Sell what you have..." he does not mean that a disciple should be destitute, this is not put forward as an ideal for Christian life in Marks Gospel. Equally, neither is the accumulation of wealth and possessions. Jesus' kingdom is one of love. It's not what we receive that makes us great, it is what we give away. It is in giving of ourselves that we grow.

People are essentially good, but this goodness has to be awakened and called forward if they are to enter the kingdom of love. *Flor McCarthy SDB New Sunday & Holy Day Liturgies*
