THE MASS SERIES – by Archbishop Mark Coleridge of the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Every 2 weeks we will, together with Archbishop Mark, share with you each part of the Mass. The series can be found on YouTube>Archdiocese of Brisbane/playlist>The Mass Series Liturgy of the Eucharist: Rite of Peace.

After the Lord's Prayer, we pray for peace; that which only God can give and that this feast signifies; sitting down at table with each other. To sit down with God, is to anticipate the peace that will come when all is

transfigured. So, we pray for peace as we come to share the feast, and then share that peace with each other, and with God. When we offer each other the sign of peace it is not just a handshake. It is so much more. It is saying that I believe that you and I are united in the body of Christ. Because of what God has done, all barriers between you and me are down and we share life in the Body of Christ. In sharing this feast, which is the Body of Christ, I am saying that I believe that you are the Body of Christ and you are saying the same to me. The Priest says: 'the Peace of the Lord be with you.' And we reply 'and with your spirit'. We recognise the truth of each other before we come to share the feast together which is the Body of Christ. The sign of peace recognises this truth, because of what God has done, and us acknowledging this in one another. This is not just bread and wine.-This is the Body and Blood of Christ, because of what God has done.

Entrance Antiphon

To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.

The Opening Prayer

Almighty ever-living God, grant that we may always conform our will to yours and serve your majesty in sincerity of heart. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

A reading from the book of Exodus 17:8-13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm until sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy 3:14-4:2

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures - from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work. Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience - but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! The word of God is living and active, it probes the thoughts and motives of our heart. Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 18:1-8

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."' And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily.

But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

Scripture reflection:

Jesus urges us in the Gospel to pray continually and never lose heart. Prayer does make a difference. It sustains us. Those who pray never lose heart. Prayer clarifies our hope and intentions. It helps us to distinguish between the important and the trivial. It teaches us what to aspire to and instils in us the ideals we ought to cherish. Prayer is not a substitute for action. It is like a beam thrown from a flashlight before us into the darkness. It helps us to go forward and encourage us to act. Prayer is not an escape from life but a journey into the heart of life. We learn to stand on our own two feet before God and the world, and to accept full responsibility for our lives. Its main purpose is to foster our relationship with God. Prayer is its own reward. It enriches us and enables us to live more spiritually, more deeply, more fully and, more authentically.
