From Friday October 13 to December 1. 6.45pm for a 7.00pm start. It's not too late to join.




# PRAYERS FOR PEACE IN THE HOLY LAND



# A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 22:15-21

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what he said. And they sent their disciples to him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that you are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to you. Tell us your opinion then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he replied, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's,' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God.'

# Scripture notes

As Christians our first and deepest loyalty is to God. Jesus was implying that there need not be conflict between the demands of the state and those of God. We are dual citizens. We are citizens of the country where we live or were born, and we owe it many benefits: to the forces of law and order we owe the fact that we are able to live in peace and security; to its public services we owe transport, water, light etc; to its social provision we have access to education, medical care etc. These benefits mean that we are under an obligation to the state: to be responsible citizens and as far as possible play our part in making the country a good place for all its citizens. Christians should not shirk public office as it is an opportunity to serve the community. Ghandi and Nelson Mandela, both involved themselves in politics as they felt that their faith and lives were intertwined. Dag Hammarskjold (Secretary General of the UN in the 1960's) felt that public service was his way of being faithful to God. He said, 'Indifference to evil is worse than evil itself, and in a free society, some are guilty, but all are responsible!' Politics is not an easy profession as there are many temptations, the chief of which is to promote one's own good rather than the good of society. 'No life is more satisfactory than that of selfless service to your country or humanity' (Dag Hammarskjold)
