Australian Bishops endorse Uluru Statement of the Heart


Australia's Catholic bishops, on the recommendation of their key Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander advisers (NATSICC), have endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart.

They made the decision as it

gathered online for its biennial meeting earlier this month.

The bishops' consideration of the matter was informed by the words

of St John Paul II, who in a visit to Alice Springs in 1986 said to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples: 'Your culture, which shows the lasting genius and dignity of your race, must not be allowed to disappear... Your songs, your stories, your paintings, your dances, your languages, must never be lost.' 
Delve Deeper into the Bible

EASING OF RESTRICTIONS

4. Introductory Rites

The Opening Prayer concludes the arc of the Introductory Rites, and it is one of the most important prayers of the Mass. If you take the Opening Prayers of the Missal, they contain everything that the Church believes and teaches. They're incredibly rich and dense little texts. The priest begins by saying, 'Let us pray.' So he summons the whole community to enter into prayer, then there follows a moment of silence. What's happening in the silence? Everyone is praying in their hearts and in that silence have been drawn into the presence of God. Out of the silence the priest gathers up the prayer of everyone in the community, 'the Collect'. Why? Because the priest collects the prayers of everyone there into a single voice and a single prayer. So, we start the opening prayer by saying Almighty, Ever-Living God, God our Father and at the end we say through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, in the unity of the Holy Spirit. There is a reminder of the Trinity and we are drawn more deeply into the life of the Trinity as we open our hearts in prayer. The structure of the opening prayers, looks back to the type of prayer that you would have heard in the state religion of Ancient Rome. It's a structure which early Christianity inherited and then adopted it. So these little prayers are deep and rich. What they do is gather up the prayer of the entire Church of every time and in every place, as well as the prayer of this particular community, but also join with the Church in Heaven. Because the prayer of the Mass is the prayer of the Church in Heaven and on Earth, so the Mass in that sense celebrates the marriage of Heaven and Earth.

2nd Sunday of Advent, Year C

Entrance Antiphon

O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

A reading from the prophet Baruch (5:1-9)

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east:

see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Philippians (1:4-6,8-11)

Every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present. I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes. God knows how much I miss you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Acclamation

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (3:1-6)

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah: 'A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

Scripture Notes

"Prepare a way for the Lord, make his pathways straight". It's not the Lord's way that needs to be straightened, it's our ways. We let misunderstandings run on from year to year, meaning to clear them up someday. We keep quarrels alive because we cannot quite make up our minds to sacrifice our pride and end them. We pass people sullenly, not speaking to them out of silly spite, and yet knowing that it would fill us with shame and remorse if we heard one of them were dead tomorrow. We let our neighbour starve, till we hear he is dying of starvation; or let our friend's heart ache for a word of appreciation, which we mean to give him someday. If only we could realise that "time is short", how it would break the spell. How we could go instantly and do the thing that we might never have another chance to do.

So if there is some crooked attitude, behaviour or relationship that needs to be straightened out, let us straighten it out, then we will truly be preparing a way for the Lord to come to us.
