

<u>A reading from the Book of Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46</u>

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, "f a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons. The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, 'Unclean, unclean'. As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp."

Responsorial Psalm

R. I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation.

Happy the man whose offence is forgiven, whose sin is remitted. O happy the man to whom the Lord imputes no guilt, in whose spirit is no guile. R.

But now I have acknowledged my sins; my guilt I did not hide. I said "I will confess my offence to the Lord. "And you, Lord, have forgiven the guilt of my sin. R.

Rejoice, rejoice in the Lord, exult, you just! O come, ring out your joy, all you upright of heart. R.

A reading from the First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Whatever you eat, whatever you drink, whatever you do at all, do it for the glory of God. Never do anything offensive to anyone - to Jews or Greeks or to the Church of God; just as I try to be helpful to everyone at all times, not anxious for my own advantage but for the advantage of everybody else, so that they may be saved. Take me for your model, as I take Christ.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people. Alleluia!

<u>A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark 1:40-45</u>

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees "If you want to" he said "you can cure me." Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. "Of course I want to!" he said. "Be cured!" And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, "Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery." The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people Jerusalem Bible ©Liturgy Brisbane from all around would come to him.

Scripture Notes

The excitement was great. So many were amazed. And their amazement at Jesus was not simply a form of curiosity. It was fuelled by faith, which is why Jesus was able to perform so many miracles there. The people quickly realised that Jesus was the One of whom the prophets had spoken. He was the Messiah, and the people gave Him their full attention. As you think of the crowds and their unwavering desire to be near our Lord, consider your own desires pertaining to God. Do you regularly find yourself consumed with a desire to find our Lord, be with Him, listen to Him and receive His grace and mercy? Or are you tempted to see Jesus and the practice of your faith as boring and uninteresting? There are many things today that compete for our attention, intrigue us and even amaze us. Is Jesus one of those things in your life? Reflect on the people in today's Gospel who were so enthralled by Jesus that they continually sought Him out. Consider their excitement, hope and genuine joy at their discovery of the Messiah. As you think about them, consider whether you share in their excitement about Jesus. If that excitement is lacking, recommit yourself to seeking out our Lord. And where you see that excitement present, rejoice and give glory to God. Catholic Life
