BISHOP'S LAUNCH STATEMENT FOR TRINITY FAMILIES 2022 APPEAL

I am delighted to launch the Diocese of Sale Trinity Families 2022 May Appeal.

- Carpet under the pews with kneelers removed, or exposed timber under the pews with carpet along the centre aisle and crossing. The Committee is satisfied that there was a clear consensus on all other key features of the church interior. There is no difference between the two options. BE BRAVE MAKE CHANGE

This is a key time in Australia's national calendar where communities come together to reflect, and assess where they are on the Reconciliation journey. For some, you may be at the beginning, for others, you may have made key changes in the way you work with and welcome First Nations people.

National Reconciliation Week: May 27-June 3

The Mass Series Once the people of God have heard God's Word, we stand and recite the Creed together. This is our way of saying "Yes, we believe the Word that we have heard. We put our trust in the God who has spoken to us." Now there are two Creeds that we use: the Creed of the Council of Nicea, happened in 325AD, with old words; the other is the Apostles' Creed. It is the baptismal Creed used in the Church of Rome in the early centuries. They're similar in the sense that they say, we believe in God Father, Son and Spirit. So, we are saying yes again to the Trinity; the Communion of God here and now; the God who has called us into His own life.; who speaks to our heart. We say yes to that God in old words but in a new way. We say, for instance, in the Council of Nicea's Creed that Jesus is *consubstantial* with the Father, which just means that He is united perfectly to the Father. To say something so unusual, we need an unusual word. In the Apostles' Creed we say that Jesus descended into hell. It means He goes into the dark world of the dead and floods that world with the light of Easter. The language is strange but at its heart the Creed, whatever its form, is the same in every age and every place. It is God's people saying yes to the God who speaks and yes to the word that we've heard here and now.

Entrance Antiphon

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

The Opening Prayer

Grant, almighty God, that we may celebrate with heartfelt devotion these days of joy, which we keep in honour of the risen Lord, and that what we relive in remembrance we may always hold to in what we do. Amen.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders. Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them: 'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication.

Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

I, John, heard a voice speaking to me: 'Very soon now, I shall be with you again, bringing the reward to be given to every man according to what he deserves. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End. Happy are those who will have washed their robes clean, so that they will have the right to feed on the tree of life and can come through the gates into the city.' I, Jesus, have sent my angel to make these revelations to you for the sake of the churches. I am of David's line, the root of David and the bright star of the morning. The Spirit and the Bride say, 'Come'. Let everyone who listens answer, 'Come'. Then let all who are thirsty come: all who want it may have the water of life, and have it free. Gospel Acclamation

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 13:31-35

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him. Those who do not love me do not keep my words. And my word is not my own; it is the word of the one who sent me. I have said these things to you while still with you; but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you.

Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you.

Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me say: I am going away, and shall return. If you loved me you would have been glad to know that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you this now, before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe.'

Scripture Notes: Peace is not the absence of war and dissension; it is not harmony or tranquillity; nor mere prosperity and well-being. These are outer things. Peace is a state of inner calm where we are in right relations with God and it is a gift of God. It is essentially communion with God. Peace results when we trust in God and the desire to please him is the dominant thing in our life. It is something we can have in the midst of turmoil, conflict and unresolved problems. Peace is one of the greatest gifts we can give to one another, but one we cannot give if we haven't got it, or give it to someone who doesn't want it. Equally, we may often inflict our own unrest and unhappiness on others, instead of peace. We can create the conditions where peace is able to take root but we can't impose peace. Jesus offers his peace to us too. Not the peace of escaping from reality, but something deeper and removed from outer circumstances. The peace that this world cannot give but a peace that no-one can take away from us.
