National Sorry Day

Sorry Day has been observed since 1998, one year after the Bringing Them Home report was presented in the Australian Federal Parliament. This report



detailed the impact of the forced removal of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children from their families. *Sorry Day* offers an opportunity to reflect on the hardship faced when children were taken into institutional and foster care by governments and church agencies and placed with non-Indigenous families. These *Stolen Generations* suffered greatly from being removed from their loved ones at such an early age, and for many the scars were life-long. However, *Sorry Day* is also an opportunity to "acknowledge the strength of Stolen Generations Survivors and reflect on how we can all play a part in the healing process for our people and nation."

The Committee is satisfied that there was a clear consensus on all other key features of the church interior. There is no difference between the two options. The Mass Series Once the people of God have heard God's Word, we stand and recite the Creed together. This is our way of saying "Yes, we believe the Word that we have heard. We put our trust in the God who has spoken to us." Now there are two Creeds that we use: the Creed of the Council of Nicea, happened in 325AD, with old words; the other is the Apostles' Creed. It is the baptismal Creed used in the Church of Rome in the early centuries. They're similar in the sense that they say, we believe in God Father, Son and Spirit. So, we are saying yes again to the Trinity; the Communion of God here and now; the God who has called us into His own life.; who speaks to our heart. We say yes to that God in old words but in a new way. We say, for instance, in the Council of Nicea's Creed that Jesus is consubstantial with the Father, which just means that He is united perfectly to the Father. To say something so unusual, we need an unusual word. In the Apostles' Creed we say that Jesus descended into hell. It means He goes into the dark world of the dead and floods that world with the light of Easter. The language is strange but at its heart the Creed, whatever its form, is the same in every age and every place. It is God's people saying yes to the God who speaks and yes to the word that we've heard here and now.

The Ascension of The Lord Year C 29th May 2022

Entrance Antiphon

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard. proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia. *The Opening Prayer*

Grant, almighty God, that we may celebrate with heartfelt devotion these days of joy, which we keep in honour of the risen Lord, and that what we relive in remembrance we may always hold to in what we do. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 1: 1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Responsorial Psalm

R. God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

All peoples, clap your hands, cry to God with shouts of joy!

For the Lord, the Most High, we must fear, great king over all the earth. R.

God goes up with shouts of joy; the Lord goes up with trumpet blast.

Sing praise for God, sing praise, sing praise to our king, sing praise. R.

God is king of all the earth. Sing praise with all your skill.

God is king over the nations; God reigns on his holy throne. R.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians 1: 17-23

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world. Alleluia! A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 24: 46-53

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this. 'And now I am sending down to you what the Father has promised. Stay in the city then, until you are clothed with the power from on high.' Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up heaven. They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.

Scripture Notes: In today's Gospel Jesus prays for the community of the future (which includes us) who would believe because of the preaching of the apostles. Jesus' main concern was for unity among them- unity NOT uniformity. Jesus' followers were diverse in terms of temperament, personality, style, and social status suggesting that he found diversity a healthy, life-giving force. True unity cannot be achieved in a community that denies difference. Unity is achieved when each member is different and contributes a different gift, but all are united around the common goal of love of neighbour. We must open ourselves to others and welcome their gifts. We are called from many different backgrounds to form one body in Christ. By rising above our many differences, we become witnesses for God who allows his light to shine in an infinite variety of ways.
