

Concluding Rites:

Once the feast is over it's time for us to go out into the world, sent by Christ. The reason for our gathering, listening to God's word, celebrating the sacrifice, and sharing the feast, is to be empowered to continue God's work with a blessing from God. The priest gives his body and his voice so that God's word, power, and blessing can flow through him into the life of the community. As we began by signing ourselves with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, so we set forth from the Mass to go out into the world on our journey in faith with the same sign of the Trinity in the final blessing. This blessing accompanies us in every step we take. "Go in the peace of Christ" completes this rite, arming us with what we need to accomplish God's will.

Entrance Antiphon

To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame.

The Opening Prayer

Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly Kingdom. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 2:1-5

In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills. All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they will say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the Temple of the God of Jacob that he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.' He will wield authority over the nations and adjudicate between many peoples; these will hammer their swords into ploughshares,

their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm

R. Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.'

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans 13:11-14

You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon - let us give up all the things we prefer to do under cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Scripture Reflection:

Preparations for Christmas often involves putting up decorations, buying gifts and making food. The season of Advent reminds us that we need to prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ in our hearts and in our deeds. So, as we begin this season, we must remember that the Lord is always in our midst. He is:

- the child who doesn't have any Christmas presents
- the homeless person who has nowhere to go for Christmas
- the person living on their own who has no close family
- the family or teenager who have left their home because of violence.
- those affected by war, flood, famine, and fire
- and those without a voice.

So, to prepare for Christ, we need to make preparations for Jesus in all of the places where we encounter Him during this time.
