This event will also contribute to the building up of our community and its culture as a Child Safe Parish.

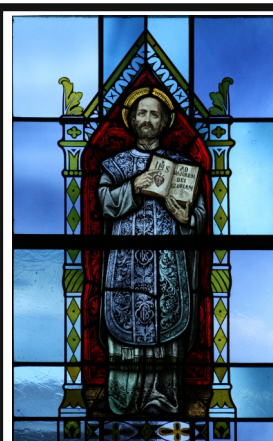

8. Liturgy of the Word - Prayers of the Faithful

We've said we believe what we have heard, we've professed our faith and then our faith becomes a prayer. We sometimes call the 'Prayer of the Faithful' – those who have put their faith in the word they have heard. This prayer is a prayer of priestly intercession, as the whole community of the faithful is a priestly community and part of priestly service is to intercede for the people and for the world. This is a prayer that looks to the Church and to ourselves, our families, whatever the needs might be, but it is the priestly people – the Church – interceding with God, in the power of the Holy Spirit, in the power of faith, for the whole world. God wants us to enter into dialogue with Him in prayer. He has spoken to us, now we speak to Him. He wants us to be part of bringing peace out of violence, bringing joy out of sorrow, bringing life out of death. He wants us to work with Him. Our prayer of intercessions recognises, that the God who has called us to Himself, is the God who listens to our prayer and wants us to work with Him for the salvation of the world. Normally there is an intention, for the Church in every place on earth and then a silence and then the prayer.

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me

For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me,
my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord
comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not
be shamed.

SCRIPTURE NOTES

In the Passion, the emphasis is on Jesus, remembering his courage, fidelity, and sheer goodness. Jesus' goodness shines all the more brightly because it is surrounded by the darkness of his betrayal, false accusations, a barrage of insults, taunts then blows and spits followed by a flogging and crucifixion, as a common criminal. In the midst of all of this Jesus cared about others around him- the women of Jerusalem, his mother, the thief. He died praying for those who put him to death.

There are times when we need to profess our faith in Jesus publicly. A word of support in defence of someone being treated unjustly, a word praising someone whose contribution is being forgotten, a word of truth when lies are being told. It isn't easy to speak out and takes courage to do so. Martin Luther King said, 'At the end of the day, it is not the words of your enemies that you remember, but the silence of your friends.' So, while we profess our faith in Christ in church, let us be careful not to ignore or deny him in everyday life.
