Thank you so much for your encouraging prayers for our children who celebrated the

Sacrament of 1st Reconciliation last



Tuesday night. I had the wonderful privilege of witnessing the sacredness of parents blessing their children from the Holy Water fountain, as a reminder of their Baptism, where they were cleansed from sin and born again through water and Spirit. This left me especially in awe and wonder knowing on a deeper level, the greatness of God's love and forgiveness received on that special evening. This beautiful gift of healing grace received by our children will help them to continue to grow in relationship with God and each other. Therefore, I would like to invite you to find a way to heal your own wounds, hurts, seeking forgiveness and make your own personal relationship with God right. So, you are warmly encouraged to participate at our St Mary's Parish Reconciliation Liturgy this week. This communal gathering begins with listening to the Word of God; the homily emphasising our need for repentance and the infinite mercy of God. During the examination of conscience, we reflect together on where we have fallen short of our baptismal commitment to follow Christ. Individual confessions and absolutions are heard by the Priest who stands 'in Persona Christi,' meaning that he is in the person of Christ. Jesus comes to heal you and the whole Church! May you be encouraged to experience this light with fellow brothers and sisters who also seek healing and forgiveness. We pray for each other so that we will know the fullness of God's grace and mercy. Once you have participated in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, you are invited to remain in Church and partake in a moving and prayerful Tenebrae. This liturgy features distinctive symbolic elements of Christ's passion and death using candles, which are gradually extinguished. Tenebrae is designed to serve as a powerful, reflective experience for the faithful ahead of the Easter Triduum. The representation of the darkness of sin and death serve to call the faithful to embrace the light of Christ, who has conquered death. God Bless you. Michelle Grimsted.

Please leave them in the 'Collection Plate' or at the Parish Centre.


Childrens Worksheets Available for Collection

Entrance Antiphon

Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out: Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy! O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 50:4-7

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Responsorial Psalm 21:8-9, 17-20, 23-24

R. My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

All who see me deride me. They curl their lips, they toss their heads. 'He trusted in the Lord, let him save him; let him release him if this is his friend.' **R.**

Many dogs have surrounded me, a band of the wicked beset me. They tear holes in my hands and my feet. I can count every one of my bones. **R.**

They divide my clothing among them. They cast lots for my robe. O Lord, do not leave me alone, my strength, make haste to help me! **R.**

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Scripture Reflection

Today's readings remind us that God's ways are not our ways, and that sometimes we must be willing to let go of our own expectations and trust in God's plan. Jesus' death on the cross was not the end, but rather the beginning of a new hope and a new life. It was through his sacrifice that we are saved, and it is through our own willingness to surrender our own desires and follow him that we can experience true freedom and salvation.

Let us reflect with humility and openness, recognizing our own limitations and weaknesses, and trusting in the infinite wisdom and love of God. May we be willing to let go of our own expectations and desires, and follow Jesus with faith and courage, even when the road ahead seems uncertain or difficult.
