EARTHQUAKE IN TURKEY (TURKIYE) AND SYRIA

Thousands of people have been killed after a catastrophic 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck southeast Turkey (officially known as Türkiye) and Syria, followed by another large earthquake (7.6 magnitude) only hours later.

Thousands of deaths have been reported in Turkiye and Syria, and the death toll is increasing by the hour. The number has now risen to over 20,000. Aid agencies report 23 million people have been affected.

Freezing Winter weather is adding to the devastation, as thousands are left injured, trapped or homeless, and are stuck in bitter cold and freezing rain. The earthquakes caused devastation in rebel-held northwest Syria, where entire buildings collapsed, leaving people trapped under the rubble.



A reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus 15:15-20

If you wish, you can keep the commandments, to behave faithfully is within your power. He has set fire and water before you; put out your hand to whichever you prefer. Man has life and death before him; whichever a men likes better will be given him. For vast is the wisdom of the Lord; he is almighty and all-seeing. His eyes are on those who fear him, he notes every action of man. He never commanded anyone to be godless, he has given no one permission to sin.

Responsorial Psalm 111:4-9

R. Happy are they who follow the law of the Lord!

They are happy whose life is blameless, who follow God's law! They are happy those who do his will, seeking him with all their hearts. **R.**

You have laid down your precepts to be obeyed with care.

May my footsteps be firm to obey your statutes. **R.**

Bless your servant and I shall live and obey your word. Open my eyes that I may consider the wonders of you law. R.

Teach me the demands of your statutes and I will keep them to the end.

Train me to observe your law, to keep it with my heart. R.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 2:6-10

We have a wisdom to offer those who have reached maturity: not a philosophy of our age, it is true, still less of the masters of our age, which are coming to their end. The hidden wisdom of God which we teach in our mysteries is the wisdom that God predestined to be for our glory before the ages began. It is a wisdom that none of the masters of this age have ever known, or they would not have crucified the Lord of Glory; we teach what scripture calls: the things that no eye has seen and no ear has heard, things beyond the mind of man, all that God has prepared for those who love him. These are the very things that God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit reaches the depths of everything, even the depths of God.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, Alleluia, Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth; you have revealed to little ones the mysteries of the kingdom. **Alleluia!**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 5:20-22, 27-28, 33-34, 37

Jesus said to his disciples: I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven. 'You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not kill; and if anyone does kill he must answer for it before the court. But I say this to you: anyone who is angry with his brother will answer for it before the court. 'You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say this to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart. 'Again, you have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not break your oath, but must fulfil your oaths to the Lord. But I say this to you: do not swear at all. All you need say is "Yes" if you mean yes, "No" if you mean no; anything more than this comes from the evil one.'

Scripture notes:

We are all subject to the law, and in this Gospel, we reflect on Jesus' attitude to the law of God. He found no fault with the law itself. It was how religious leaders of the day interpreted and applied it. For them the letter of the law was more important, but for Jesus it was the spirit of the law that mattered. The Pharisees looked at the outward act, but God sees in our hearts, thoughts and desires. Jesus interpreted the commandments in a positive way. Instead of 'Thou shalt not kill', He said, 'Love thy neighbour'; 'Thou shalt not steal' He said, 'You must share your goods with your neighbour when they are in need'. He also saw that obedience was often rooted in fear and he wanted it founded in love. All God's laws could be reduced to two: love of God and love of neighbour. These two, properly understood, include all the others. In a sense there is only one law – the law of love, and only one sin, not to love.
