CRISIS IN AFRICA

Somalia

Somalia is on the brink of famine, with nearly 8 million people facing extreme

hunger and food insecurity. The last famine declared in Somalia, in 2011, killed a quarter of a million people.

If urgent action is not taken, Somalia may face a catastrophic humanitarian disaster.

Ethiopia

Ethiopia is facing its worst drought in nearly 40 years, with an estimated 20 million people in need of urgent assistance. This is on top of one of the worst locust swarms in the past decade and ongoing conflict that has displaced thousands of vulnerable people.

Kenya

More than 4.35 million people in Kenya are at risk of severe hunger, particularly in the north of the country in areas such as Marsabit. A national state of disaster has been declared with vulnerable communities struggling to access food and clean

water.



Third Sunday of Advent-Year A December 10—11 2022

Entrance Antiphon

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

The Opening Prayer

O God, who see how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity, enable us, we pray, to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 35:1-6, 10

Let the wilderness and the dry lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy. The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon, they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God, he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return. They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces, joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

Responsorial Psalm

R. Lord, come and save us

It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to those who are oppressed.

It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord, who sets prisoners free. R.

It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down,

the Lord, who protects the stranger and upholds the widow and orphan. R.

It is the Lord who loves the just but thwarts the path of the wicked.

A reading from the letter of St James 5:7-10

Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; he sent me to bring Good News to the poor. Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 11:2-11

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.' As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'

Scripture notes:

Today is called "Gaudete Sunday" because today's Mass (in its Latin, pre-Vatican II form), began with the opening antiphon: Rejoice in the Lord always." Advent was a season of penance, the celebrant, wearing vestments of penitential purple or violet, reminds us to prepare for the birth of Jesus (the celebrant wore rose-coloured vestments on the third Sunday). Today we light the rose candle, and the priest may wear rose vestments. The main theme running through today's readings is one of joy as we await the rebirth of Jesus in our hearts and lives. Paul, in the second reading, advises us to "rejoice always" by leading blameless, holy, and thankful lives guided by the Holy Spirit. Today's Gospel tells us that John the Baptiser came as a witness to testify to the Light- Jesus- the 'Light', as he removes darkness from the world. We should be glad and rejoice because, like John the Baptiser, we are chosen to bear witness to Christ Jesus. We are to reflect Jesus' Light in our lives so that we may radiate it and illuminate the dark lives of others around us. The salvation we are waiting for will liberate both the individual and the community, specifically focusing on the poor and lowly, not the rich and powerful. The readings remind us that the coming of Jesus, past, present and future, is the reason for our rejoicing.
